



I had the pleasure of being a guest speaker on KWAM talking about slavery and Juneteenth. So, what exactly is Juneteenth? According to "Galveston History: Juneteenth and General Order No. 3, President Abraham Lincoln announced the Emancipation Proclamation on September 22, 1862. The Proclamation declared that on January 1, 1863, all persons held as slaves within any state or designated part of a State the people whereof shall then be in rebellion against the US shall be then, thenceforward, and forever be free..." However, Lincoln's proclamation would have little impact on Texas due to the small number of Union troops available to enforce it there. On June 19, 1865, the people of Galveston, Texas, were informed that all slaves were free. This information states an absolute equality of personal rights and rights of property between masters and slaves. Approximately 250,000 slaves in Texas were impacted. They were the last of the slaves to find out about freedom. Juneteenth celebrates a remarkable feat for our country.

Two-tiered System of Justice
